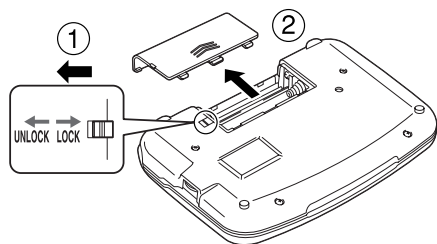
Preparation for using the Unit

■ Installing Batteries

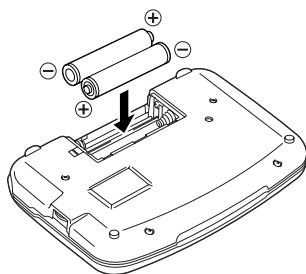
The unit is powered by two “AAA” size batteries.

Before using the unit, please install the batteries as follows.

1. Turn the unit over.
2. Slide the tab to the left and then **unlock** and remove the battery cover.

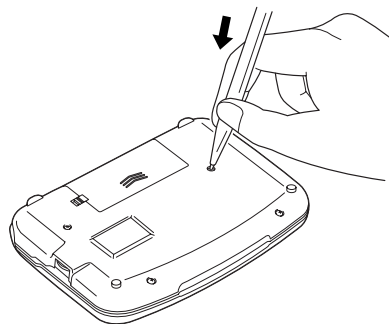


3. Insert two “AAA” batteries according to the polarity (+, -) marks inside the battery compartment.



4. After replacing the battery cover, slide the tab to the right and **lock** the battery cover.

5. Press the “RESET” button on the bottom of the unit.




6. A demonstration display will appear.
(See page 3.)

Resetting

If the unit does not operate properly after the battery has been replaced, or if at any time the unit fails to operate properly, gently press the “RESET” button on the bottom of the unit.

NOTE: Resetting product erases the Easy Learn List in the memory.

Changing Batteries

The battery mark () will appear at the right of the screen when the batteries are almost exhausted, meaning that it is time to replace them.

- Press the “RESET” button on the bottom of the unit after battery replacement.
- Make sure that power is switched off before replacing batteries.
- Do not use a previously used battery together with a new battery.
- If the unit is subjected to an electrostatic discharge it may lock up, the batteries should be removed and replaced in order to overcome this problem.

CAUTION

- The batteries may pose a choking hazard to small children.
- Keep the batteries and product away from small children.
- Do not expose the batteries to open flame or intense heat.
- Rechargeable batteries cannot be used.
- Do not try to recharge batteries.
- Never use batteries other than those specified.
- Remove the batteries from the unit if you do not intend to use it for a long duration.

You can stop the demonstration by pressing any of the keys.
